



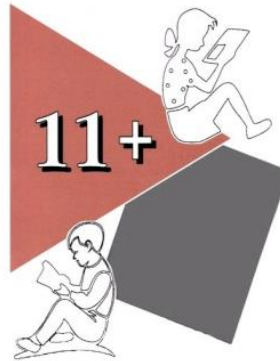

*The objectives of this booklet are to give you a clearer insight into what is involved in the Selection Test (11+), including:*

- *What schools are associated with the CSSE.*
- *How to apply for the Selection Test*
- *How to prepare for the Selection Test*
- *To set out the dates involved with the Selection Test.*

## **SELECTIVE SCHOOLS**

Essex has a small number of Selective or Grammar schools. Selective schools have **admission criteria** which state **highest rank** in the selection tests as their **first** admission criteria. The nearest ones being:

- King Edward VI Grammar School (Boys)
  - Colchester County High School for Girls
  - Colchester Royal Grammar School (Boys)
  - Southend (1 boys' school, 1 girls' school)
  - Westcliff (1 boys' school, 1 girls' school)
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- Chelmsford County High for Girls – are not part of the same process, they have their own admission exam, called the CEM 11+ Entrance Test. Details of their application process are available on their website [www.cchs.co.uk](http://www.cchs.co.uk) under 'Admissions.' Their application process opens on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> May 2018 and closes on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> June 2018. The entrance test will be on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> September 2018.

## **BACKGROUND**

- Only the top 2-3% of children in Essex will obtain a place at a selective school. In our school this would be the top 1 or 2 in each class.
- Emphasise to your children that it's not a pass or fail and they will succeed at any school they go to.
- The consortium control the whole process, White Court School are not consulted
- It's up to parents to purchase the practice papers and work through them with your child. We will support them, but we do not coach them at school.

## **REGISTERING**

- Children will apply for the Selective Test early, take the test early and receive their results early. Along with the results will be advice that lets you know if your child has a realistic chance of securing a place at the Selective Schools. See Page 4 for a list of dates.
- Copies of the application packs will be sent to me during May, as soon as I receive them, I will send them out to you.
- Make sure you copy the application form before you send it or email it.
- You will be notified of the test centre where your child will be sitting the test nearer the time.
- You then need to list all your preferred Secondary Schools in the Secondary School Application Form, in order of preference. Including Selective Schools if it has been indicated your child has a realistic chance of being accepted. Please remember you will then only have 2 weeks left to fill in the form and send it off (by 31<sup>st</sup> October 2018).
- CSSE schools will hold open days/evening throughout the year. These dates will be in the Information Guide sent out during May.

## **ON THE TEST DAY**

- **Test day - Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2018** (could be a.m. or p.m.)
- Illness – They will give you an alternative test day, but you must have a doctor's certificate.
- If the weather is poor, listen to the local radio station or contact the test centre.
- The children need to take a pencil case with a pencil, ruler and rubber.

## **FORMAT OF THE TEST**

- English – comprising of Comprehension, Grammar and Vocabulary questions, two pieces of continuous writing, and Applied Reasoning (literacy/verbal). This will last one hour, with 10 minutes additional reading time and is worth 60 marks in total.
- Mathematics – comprising of questions consistent with KS2 of the National Curriculum and Applied Reasoning (mathematical/non-verbal). This will also last one hour and be worth 60 marks.
- One set of free CSSE familiarisation papers are available to download from [www.csse.org.uk](http://www.csse.org.uk) and past papers are available to buy.

# Preparing for the 11+

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The purpose of the 11+ test is to select the children who have the potential to thrive in an environment which provides a highly academic curriculum and a range of challenging pursuits.

Such children will have demonstrated some of the following:

- curiosity, enjoyment of learning and problem solving
- perseverance and completion of challenging tasks
- understanding of all concepts taught at primary school
- enjoyment of a wide range of literature and / or non-fiction texts
- creativity in sustained writing
- ability to make connections between various areas of knowledge
- good memory
- imagination and original ideas
- ability to work at pace and assimilate information quickly

The Headteachers of the CSSE schools believe that in addition of the above, children should:

- be familiar with reading and responding to texts with a reading age greater than 11
- understand the rudiments of spelling, grammar and punctuation.

Whilst it is advisable for children to spend a few hours familiarising themselves with the style of responses required in the papers, this can be done at home, using materials and papers available on the CSSE website.

Headteachers share a concern that extensive coaching for the 11+ is inappropriate, ultimately counterproductive and may jeopardize a child's ability to cope with the demands of a grammar school education.
